

They were already finding it difficult supporting their three children on their monthly salary of \$500. They had no idea how they were going to pay the hospital fees for the quintuplets, much less to feed **them** and bring them up.
- 2) The birth of the quintuplets made headlines throughout the city. Offers to adopt the infants came flowing in. Advertising companies offer contracts in return for a life-time supply of pampers and other apparels.
